DEFEAT AT THE BATTLE OF UHUD

But do not think of those that have been slain in God's cause as dead. Nay, they are alive! With their Sustainer have they their sustenance. Holy Quran 3:169

The Battle of Uhud occurred during the 3rd year post migration (Hijra) from Mecca. The pagan Arabs, led by Abu Sufyan ibn Harb and the Ouraysh, ventured to meet the Muslims near Medina in retaliation for the massive defeat experienced by the Meccans a year earlier at Badr. The Battle of Uhud starts as a decisive victory for the Muslims before the rear guard abandons their post at Mt. Uhud, leaving an opening for a contingent among the Ouraysh, led by Khalid ibn Waleed, to advance a counterattack that results in significant losses for the Muslims. This turn of events often leads to Uhud being described as a defeat for the Muslims and a victory for the Quraysh.

While the Muslims undoubtedly experienced significant losses, and more loss than the initial progression would suggest is necessary, should Uhud be considered a defeat against the Muslims?

Dhul Qadah is the Eleventh month of the Islamic (Hijri) Calendar

Dhul Qadah is the 11th month of the Islamic (Hijri) calendar and one of the four sacred months as ordained by Allah (SWT).

"They ask you [Prophet] about fighting in the prohibited month. Say, 'Fighting in that month is a great offence..." [Qur'an, 2:217] It is during this month that the initiation of fighting is prohibited, as it is also in the three remaining sacred months Dhul Hijjah, Muharram, and Rajab.

Historically, since fighting is prohibited by Allah during the month of Dhul Qadah, pilgrims have been able to Hajj safely without the worry of war.

The month also holds some notable dates which are significant to Islam, including marking the month the Treaty of Hudaybiyyah was signed in 628 AD, signifying the day Islam was recognized by the Quraysh tribe. This allowed Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and his companions to safely return to Mecca without fear of violence.

This ultimately led to the Prophet (PBUH) and his companions being able to complete the first Umrah to

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
Since the hijra, the Quraysh were experiencing heavy losses in trade due to the Muslims in Medina intercepting caravans en route between Mecca and the Levant. The Battle of Badr began as one such interception before becoming a defeat and overwhelming loss for the Quraysh in money, leadership, and prestige. From the Quraysh's standpoint, their objective at Uhud was to defeat the Muslims to reopen their trade route as well as avenge their defeat.

To this end, the Quraysh amassed a well-armed fighting force superior numbers and equipment against the Muslims - just as they had in Badr.

Of course, the Quraysh failed in this objective. Not only were the Muslims, with fewer numbers and inferior equipment, once again not eliminated, the **Prophet** continued to spread the Islamic message and the Muslims remained in Medina and continued to raid Quraish caravans just as before the Battle of Uhud. The Muslims experienced significant losses, but the Quraysh failed in their objective and the Muslims defended their position in Medina and their strategic position along the Ouraysh's trade route. Furthermore, the failure of the Quraysh at Uhud is evident by the need to, yet again, amass an even larger fighting force for the Battle of the Khandag.

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Still yet again, the Quraysh's failure to meet their objectives is considered a defeat for them, notwithstanding the losses experienced by the Muslims along the way.

At the end of Uhud, Abu Sufvan would claim to have dealt a blow to the Muslims - deaths of Muslims to avenge those of the Quraysh the previous year.

However, what the Ouraysh knew at the time, and what we often neglect, is that they went to Medina on a mission, and that mission was a failure. Muslim numbers influence would continue to grow, despite the losses, while the Quraysh would continue to deal with a situation, they could neither contain nor defeat.

In this light, who was defeated in the Battle of Uhud?
